

Hope to see you in Kenton, OK for Okie-Tex!



FIGHT LIGHT POLLUTION - Join the International Dark Sky Association - .We all experience the excesses of Light Pollution. The IDA's goal is to provide information and solutions to decrease the light spilling into our night sky. From now until November 1st, the IDA is offering a one-year membership for just \$20 (a \$10 discount) to anyone who belongs to an astronomy club.
